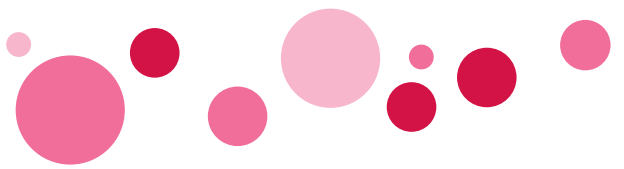
2011 - Year of the Rabbit

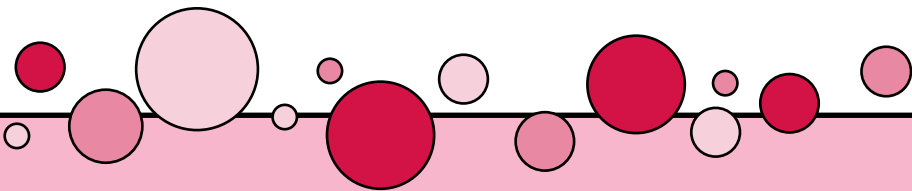
